Doesn't cost much and could be easily replaced. The ball here stands for childhood and the loss of ball

is the loss of childhood and his dreams.

So the child cant be consoled as the childhood cant be brought back.
 Ultimately a change comes

and the grieving boy understands that losing is a part of life. Loss must not break our spirit. We must

accept the loss, stand up and move ahead with courage and determination.
